RTC Adds 22 New Traffic Cameras on U.S. 95 Live Traffic Feeds Also Available Online

Drivers will have several new traffic cameras to help them view their commute *before* they get behind the wheel. The Nevada Department of Transportation and the Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) are adding 22 new traffic cameras to the network of cameras that help to manage traffic throughout the valley. The new cameras are on U.S. 95 between the Spaghetti Bowl and the 215 Beltway in the northern part of the valley. The cameras are part of an integrated network of technology that will provide drivers with real-time information on traffic conditions.

The new cameras are located on U.S. 95 in the following locations:

These cameras are in addition to the 70 cameras that the RTC's Freeway and Arterial System of Transportation (FAST) division operates along valley freeways and major roadways. Live feeds of most of the traffic cameras are available on the RTC's Web site at www.rtcnv.com. The cameras will be accessible on Monday, Oct. 12. Dynamic message signs, freeway ramp meters and travel time estimates will be added to this stretch of U.S. 95 in the coming months. Those tools are already in use along I-15 from the Spaghetti Bowl to the 215 Beltway in the southern part of the valley. With these additional traffic management tools in place, FAST can provide reports of traffic delays occurring along the U.S. 95 corridor.
