Transit service schedule during 2010 UNLV football season announced

LAS VEGAS – Heading to Sam Boyd Stadium for Rebel football games? The Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) provides transit service to Sam Boyd Stadium for University of Nevada Las Vegas (UNLV) football games. Routes 601 and 602 provide service to the stadium as follows:

Those traveling from properties on the Las Vegas Strip can board Route 602 at the eastbound bus stop located on Tropicana Avenue and Las Vegas Boulevard. Route 602 provides express roundtrip service from the Strip and UNLV to Sam Boyd Stadium, with buses departing approximately every 20 minutes. Customers in the eastern portion of the Valley can board either Route 602 or Route 601, a short, continuous loop route, at the bus stop on eastbound Tropicana Avenue east of Boulder Highway.

It is recommended that riders purchase a 24-hour pass for \$5 to cover their complete round trip, or a \$7 24-hour pass for customers that plan to use the Deuce on the Strip or Strip & Downtown Express service.
