RTC Transit Detours Scheduled for Sunday, Dec. 4 *Detours due to Zappos.com Rock 'n' Roll Las Vegas Marathon*

LAS VEGAS -- Several Regional Transportation Commission of Southern Nevada (RTC) transit routes will be detoured on Sunday, Dec. 4, due to the Zappos.com Rock 'n' Roll Las Vegas Marathon. The following routes will be impacted on Sunday between the hours of 2:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. Times are approximate and may be adjusted depending on the timing of the event. Maps showing detours on the affected routes are included below.

- **Deuce on the Strip:** Service will be altered and there will be no service on Las Vegas Boulevard between downtown Las Vegas and Mandalay Bay. To bypass the Strip, the Deuce will operate primarily along Paradise Road and Koval Lane.
- **The Strip & Downtown Express (SDX):** Service will be altered and there will be no service on Las Vegas Boulevard between downtown Las Vegas and Mandalay Bay. To bypass the Strip, SDX will operate along Dean Martin Drive and Industrial Road. Temporary stops will be made available along these streets to service the resort corridor as close as possible. Service to the Fremont Street area, the Las Vegas Premium Outlets North and South, the BTC and the South Strip Transfer Terminal (SSTT) will be maintained.
- **Route 102 (Jones):** Service will not reach Hacienda Avenue. There will be no service south of Reno Avenue. Route timing should not be affected.
- **Route 103 (Decatur):** This route will be detoured between Tropicana Avenue and Russell Road, with no service on Decatur Boulevard between Tropicana Avenue and Russell Road.
- **Route 104 (Valley View / Torrey Pines):** This route will be on detour south of Tropicana Avenue. There will be no service in the Russell Road area.
- **Route 108 (Paradise):** This route will be on detour north of Sahara Avenue. Service will not be provided on Main Street south of Bonneville Avenue; there will be no service on Bonneville Avenue or on Gass Street, east of 4th Street.
- **Route 109 (Maryland Parkway):** This route will be on detour between the Bonneville Transit Center and Maryland Parkway. There will be no service along Bonneville Avenue, between 4th Street and Maryland Parkway.
- **Route 113 / MAX:** This route will be on detour traveling southbound in the Downtown area. Both routes will serve Casino Center Boulevard at Fremont Street before proceeding to the Bonneville Transit Center.
- **Route 119 (Simmons / Koval):** This route will be unable to reach Spring Mountain Road at Las Vegas Boulevard. The nearest access to the Strip will be along Koval Lane. The route will also terminate at Tropicana Avenue, providing no service to the Russell Road, Valley View Boulevard and Polaris Avenue area.
- **Route 201 (Tropicana):** There will be major detours on this route. Service will be disrupted between I-15 and Swenson Street. The nearest access to Las Vegas Boulevard will be at Tropicana Avenue and Dean Martin Drive.

- **Route 202 (Flamingo):** There will be major detours on this route. Service will be disrupted between Valley View Boulevard and Koval Lane. The nearest access to Las Vegas Boulevard will be at Flamingo Road and Koval Lane or at Flamingo Road and Valley View Boulevard.
- **Route 203 (Spring Mountain / Twain):** This route will be on detour between Polaris Avenue (Valley View Boulevard westbound) and Paradise Road. The nearest access to Las Vegas Boulevard will be at Spring Mountain Road and Polaris Avenue or at Twain Avenue and Paradise Road. Riders may transfer to Routes 202 or 119 to access Sands Avenue and Koval Lane.
- **Route 204 (Sahara):** Eastbound Route 204 will be on detour between Rancho Drive and Paradise Road. Route 204 westbound detoured between Paradise Road and Teddy Drive. There will be no service along Sahara Avenue between the Palace Station Hotel and Paradise Road.
- **Route 206 (Charleston):** This route will be on detour between Casino Center Boulevard and Maryland Parkway. There will be no service along Charleston Boulevard, between Casino Center Boulevard and Maryland Parkway, but will still the Bonneville Transit Center.
- **Route 208 (Washington):** This route will be on detour in the downtown area. Eastbound trips will not serve Carson Street between 4th Street and 7th Street or 7th Street between Carson Street and Ogden Avenue. Westbound trips will not serve 7th Street between Stewart Avenue and Carson Street or Carson Street between 7th Street and Casino Center Boulevard.
- **The Centennial Express (CX):** This route will be on detour and unable to reach Spring Mountain Road at Las Vegas Boulevard. The nearest access to the Strip will be at stops normally served by Route 203 located on Spring Mountain Road between I-15 and Polaris Avenue.
- **The Westcliff Airport Express (WAX):** This express route will be on detour and unable to serve Tropicana Avenue at Las Vegas Boulevard. To access the Strip, use either the SDX or the Deuce on the Strip from the Bonneville Transit Center.

Maps showing detours on the affected routes:

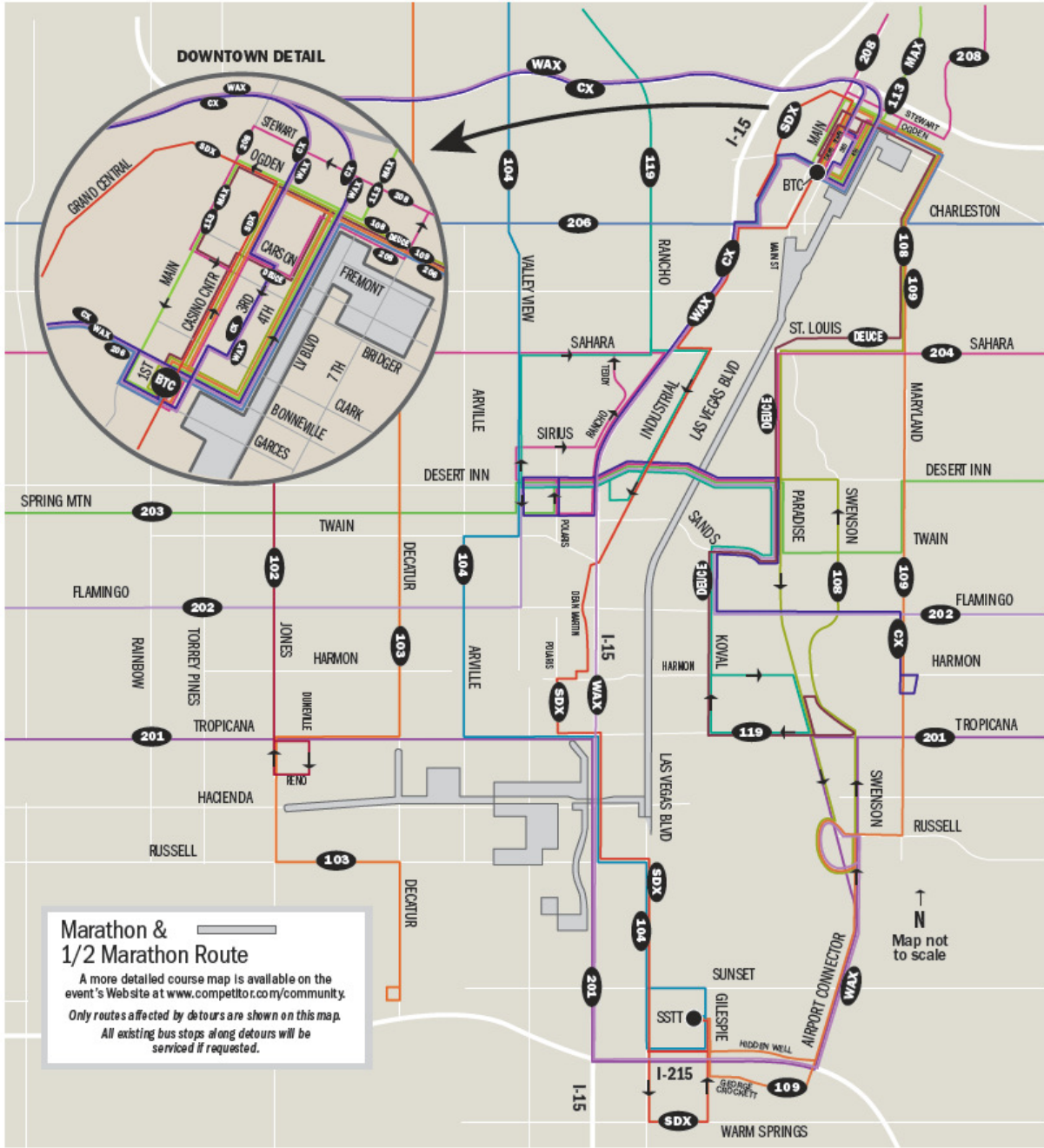
Strip & Downtown Express (SDX) and Deuce on the Strip DETOURS
